Short Title: Capital penalty for intentional killing

Primary Scripture: Exodus 21:12, 14

Category: JUS – Capital Crimes

NT fulfillment:

Civil sword recognized (Rom 13:4) while calling believers to personal non-vengeance (Rom 12:19).

Logos / Rhema:

Logos: capital penalty for intentional killing.

Rhema: affirms sanctity of life and state's responsibility to restrain bloodshed.

Republic Module: M-JUS, M-GOV

T-EX-017

Short Title: Distinction between manslaughter and murder (cities of refuge principle)

Primary Scripture: Exodus 21:13

Category: JUS – Due Process & Intent

NT fulfillment:
