

ALIENS, DECEIVING SPIRITS, AND THE GREAT ESCHATOLOGICAL DISTRACTION

A Scriptural, Theological, Political, and Economic Refutation of Modern UFO Narratives

Abstract

Modern alien and UFO narratives—popularized through alternative biblical reinterpretations, media, and government disclosure efforts—constitute a coherent counter-theology that undermines biblical revelation, displaces God as Creator and Sovereign, and conditions humanity to accept false authorities. This paper examines prominent works within the ancient-astronaut and paleo-contact tradition, including *The Eden Conspiracy* by Paul Wallis and *The Naked Bible* by Mauro Biglino, demonstrating that their claims are not supported by Scripture. The paper further argues that alien narratives function as psychological preparation for expanded governmental authority and are sustained by significant financial incentives. 1. Introduction

Throughout history, false religious systems have repeatedly emerged by re-interpreting divine revelation through alternative cosmologies and secret knowledge. In the modern era, this pattern has reappeared in the form of alien and UFO narratives, which reinterpret biblical texts as records of extraterrestrial intervention rather than divine action. While often presented as neutral scholarship or scientific curiosity, these narratives function theologically, politically, and economically in ways that merit serious examination.

2. Core Claims of Modern Alien Theology
