

The Importance of a Godly Republic

Abstract

Foundational Premise

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I. Why a Godly Republic Is Important

1. Because righteousness, not tyranny, exalts a nation

- **Proverbs 14:34** – “Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin condemns any people.”
- **Proverbs 29:2** – “When the righteous are in authority, the people rejoice: but when the wicked rule, the people mourn.”
- **Isaiah 33:22** – “For the Lord is our judge, the Lord is our lawgiver, the Lord is our king; it is he who will save us.”

This verse shows the divine pattern of governance — judicial, legislative, and executive powers all under God’s authority — mirroring the structure of a righteous Republic.

2. Because God calls nations to walk in justice and truth

- **Micah 6:8** – “He has shown you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with your God?”
- **Jeremiah 18:7–10** – God tells Jeremiah that if a nation repents of evil, He will relent from judgment, but if it turns from righteousness, He will withhold His blessing.
