Discernment Key (Unifying Test)

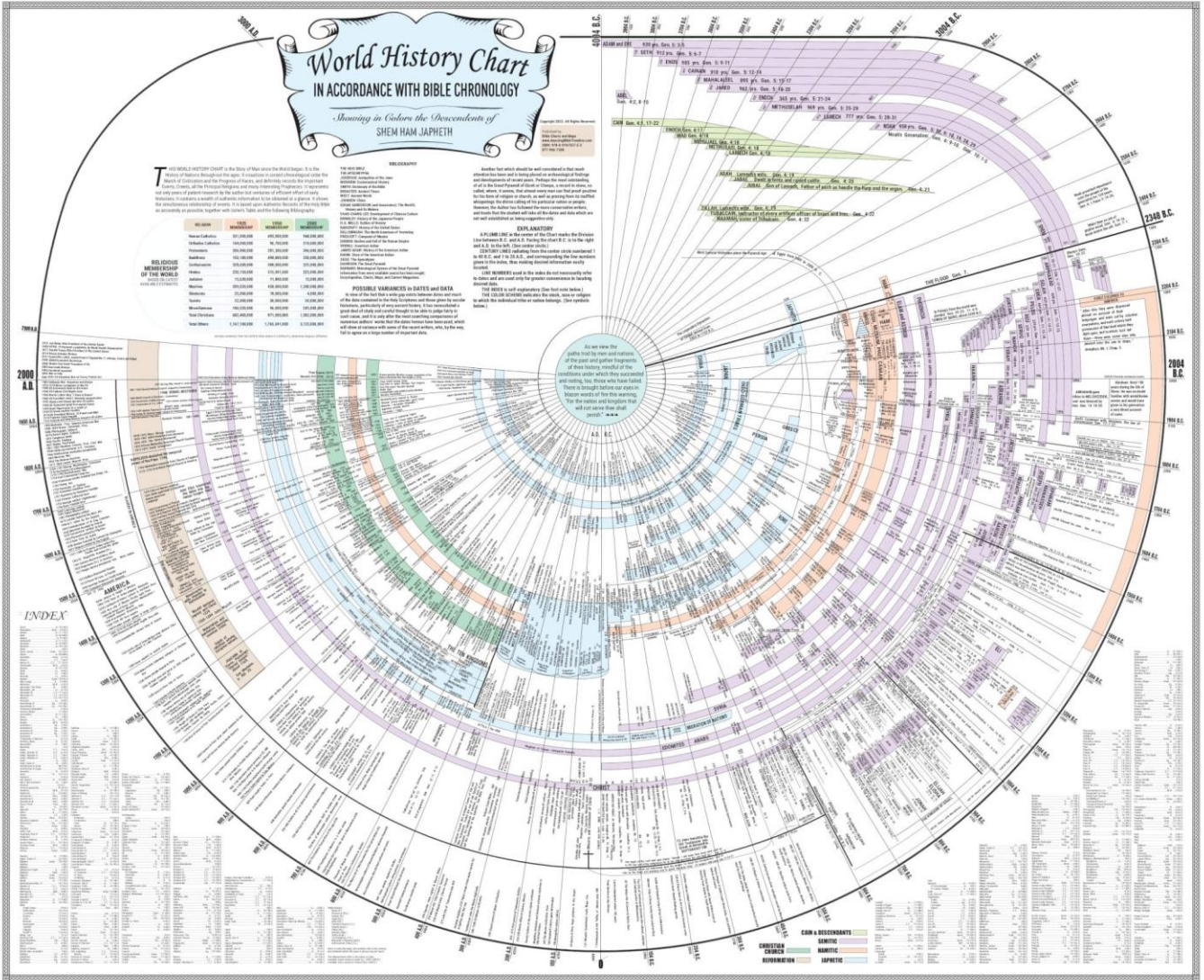
Wherever God moves to restore covenant order, Satan moves to counterfeit the outcome while delaying obedience.

4. **Is time being used to exhaust obedience?**
